When does CPD Year 2025 run?

CPD Year 2025 runs from 1 January 2025 to 31 December 2025

How many CPD Points do I need to obtain for CPD Year 2025?

Group

1

Lawyers

(Admitted to the Singapore Bar on or after 2 January 2020)

You need to obtain



CPD Points.
At least 8 must be Public CPD Points.

Group

2

Lawyers

(Admitted to the Singapore Bar between 1 January 2010 and 1 January 2020)

You need to obtain

10

CPD Points.
At least 5 must be Public CPD Points.

Group

3

Lawyers

(Admitted to the Singapore Bar on or before 31 December 2009)

You need to obtain

7

CPD Points.

At least 3.5 must be Public CPD Points.

s36BFL

(Foreign lawyers registered under section 36B of the Legal Profession Act)

You need to obtain

10

CPD Points.
At least 5 must be Public CPD Points.

Out of your total required CPD Points, you will need to obtain 3 MEC* Points.

(*Mandatory Ethics Component)

At least 1.5 of these must be Public MEC Points.

*You may have different points requirements if you hold your PC/FPC for less than 8 months during CPD Year 2025, or if you avail of a <u>deemed waiver</u>.

CPD Points

Attend an Accredited CPD Activity

Perform certain roles in the Part A and Part B Courses and the Foreign Practitioner Examinations.

MEC Points

Private

Attend an eligible non-accredited activity. Such as a conference, lecture, seminar, or workshop.

Review an eligible multimedia, Internet-based, audio-visual, audio or video programme or material. See our <u>Guide to e- Learning</u> for more information

Attend an in-house seminar conducted for lawyers.

Public MEC Points:

Attend an Accredited CPD Activity which carries MEC Points.

See <u>CALAS</u> for a full list of Accredited CPD Activities and use the MEC filter to search for activities with MEC Points.

Private MEC Points:

Undertake an eligible non-accredited activity on ethics and professional standards.

Such as watching a video or attending an in-house seminar on ethics and professional standards.

You can obtain MEC Points from activities which are partially MEC and partially non-MEC. For example, you can obtain 4 Public CPD Points from an Accredited CPD Activity, of which 2 are Public MEC Points and 2 are Public CPD Points (non-MEC).
