When does CPD Year 2026 run?

CPD Year 2026 runs from 1 January 2026 to 31 December 2026

How many CPD Points do I need to obtain for CPD Year 2026?

Group

Lawyers

(Admitted to the Singapore Bar on or after 2 January 2021)

You need to obtain



CPD Points.

At least 8 must be Public CPD Points *Up to 8 CPD Points may be from teaching. *Up to 6.5 CPD Points may be from teaching.

(Admitted to the Singapore Bar between 1 January 2011 and 1 January 2021)

You need to obtain



CPD Points.

Group

Lawyers

(Admitted to the Singapore Bar on or before 31 December 2010)

You need to obtain



CPD Points.

At least 6.5 must be Public CPD Points. At least 5 must be Public CPD Points. At least 6.5 must be Public CPD Points.

s36RFI

(Foreign lawyers registered under section 36B of the Legal Profession Act)

You need to obtain



CPD Points.

Out of your total CPD Points, at least 3 must be MEC Points;

At least 1.5 of these must be Public MEC Points

**You may have different points requirements if you hold your PC/FPC for less than 8 months during the CPD Year, or if you avail of a deemed waiver.

How do I obtain CPD Points?

Public CPD Points Attend an Accredited CPD Activity See **CALAS** for a full list of Accredited CPD Activities

Perform certain roles in the Part A and Part B Courses and the Foreign Practitioner Examinations.

Such as a conference, lecture, seminar, or workshop.

Private CPD Points Attend an eligible non-accredited activity.

Review an eligible multimedia, Internet-based, audio-visual, audio or video programme or material. See our **Guide to e- Learning** for more information

Attend an in-house seminar conducted for lawyers.

Public MEC Points:

Attend an Accredited CPD Activity which carries MEC Points. See CALAS for a full list of Accredited CPD Activities and use the MEC filter to search for activities with MEC Points.

Private MEC Points:

Undertake an eligible non-accredited activity on ethics and professional standards.

Such as watching a video or attending an in-house seminar on ethics and professional standards.

You can obtain MEC Points from activities which cover both MEC and non-MEC content. Example: During a 2-hour seminar on family law, there is a 30-minute segment on ethical obligations of lawyers in family law matters. You may obtain 2 CPD Points, of which 0.5 CPD Points are MEC Points.
